SHAHU was a prince of state with noble and kind heart and full compassion for the down trodden and lepers who are discarded by the society for their ugly disease. In his letter dated 16th April 1896 to governor Sandhurst to acquaints the governor with the condition of the people in Gadguinglaj and Bhudargad petas and expresses his desire to see that the actual cultivators hold lands in their own names; he also mentions the opening of the girls school and a school for the Mohammedans in the districts near the sahyadri and his desire to segregate the lepers in Nadsobawadi (906-907) ; he even proposed a separate Hospital for lepers and another for general diseases (1018 – 1019, dated 8th July 1897).
