The Story of The Punjab Indian Mission 1907 to 1969

In 1913 the Mission took over leprosy work in the isolated district of Subathu. This required the attendance of one of our missionaries which contributed to stretching of staff resources to the limit during the First World War ... In 1922 this area was handed over to an adjoining Mission enabling the NZ Presbyterian Mission to consolidate its existing area.

The Story of The Madras Indian Mission 1892 to 1908

'From as early as 1892, the Presbyterian Church in New Zealand and primarily the Presbyterian Women's Missionary Union financially supported a number of Women Missionaries working for the United Free Church of Scotland and Church of Scotland Missions in or around Madras and Nagpur in Southern India.

Mission work at this time concentrated on Village evangelism and preaching, children's education and the running of boarding schools (for both Christian and non-Christian Hindu girls), care of orphans, Industrial training for girls, zenana work (house to house visiting), as well as leper asylum and hospital visiting.' *Donald Cochrane, PCANZ Archives, May 2001*
